<p>rankings, a flush beats a straight, regardless of the strength of the

straight. &#127771; The</p>

<p>odds against making a straight in Texas Hold em are about 21-to-1, mak

ing it a more</p>

<p>common hand than a &#127771; flush (32-to-1 odds against).</p>

<p>Does a straight beat a full house?</p>

<p>No.</p>

<p>The odds against making a full house in Texas Hold em &#127771; are a

bout 36-to-1, while the odds</p>

<p>against making a straight are about 21-to-1. Both are strong five-card

hands, but a</p>

<p>&#127771; full house occurs less often than a straight. A full house

beats a straight in the</p>

<p>poker hand rankings.</p>

<p>Does three &#127771; of a kind beat two pair?</p>

<p>two pair can make a lot of money &#127771; in poker, but three of a k

ind is the best hand when it</p>

<p>Hold em is about 20-to-1, while the odds against making two &#127771;

pair is about 3-to-1.</p>

<p>Does</p>

<p>three of a kind beat a straight?</p>

<p>No. The odds of making both of these hands are &#127771; very</p>

<p>close in a game of Texas Hold em. The odds against making a straight a

re 20.6-to-1,</p>

<p>while the odds against &#127771; making three of a kind are 19.7-to-1

<p>slightly less often, making it the winner against three &#127771; of
