and Olaria as a youth, but retired at early age.

He subsequently appeared professionally in futsal, but retired at the a

ge of 25.

In 1992, aged only 21, Ricardo was appointed manager

of futsal club Vila Isabel.

He subsequently went on to manage Vasco da Gama and Botafogo

in the 1990s, and also took charge of adult teams in Italy.[1]

Ricardo arrived at Flamengo in 1998, still in futsal

.

In 2005, he moved to football, being initially in charge of the youth c

ategories.

In 2008 Ricardo left Fla and was appointed manager o

f Audax Rio.

ple tournaments with the under-18s and under-20s.
